Arlington, VA – January 21, 2009 – The Performance Institute, a public policy think tank and government training provider, launched InnoGOV.org today, a part of the Innovations in Government project. InnoGOV.org is designed as a series of forums, breakfasts, webinars, research and recommendations to share and shape innovations and insights in federal management. Visitors will be able to comment and share on various management issues, focusing mainly on performance management.
